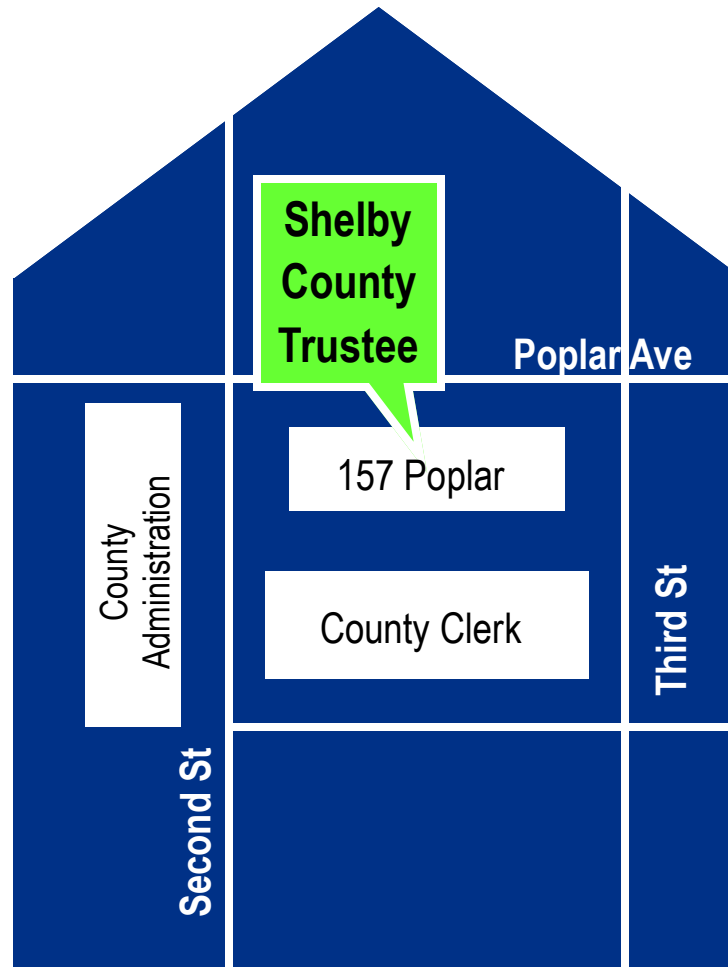

What is Project H.O.M.E.?

Each year thousands of Shelby County home owners face the possibility of losing their property due to unpaid property taxes. The Shelby County Trustee recognizes the financial challenges all residents face but is also keenly aware of the overall impact of this issue on homeowners.

Project H.O.M.E.'s FREE financial counseling workshops and foreclosure prevention events put solutions into the hands of taxpayers.

Financial Counseling

Participants who successfully complete a free Project H.O.M.E. workshop and meet all the requirements are eligible for a payment plan. The payment plan reduces the risk of the taxpayer's property being sold in a tax sale to satisfy their tax debt. Qualifications

- Initial payment: Total due of oldest year of past due taxes **OR** 10 percent of total, whichever is greater. Payment must be in cash, money order or cashier's check.
- Workshop certificate
- Completed spending plan or monthly income/expense worksheet presented at workshop
- Valid driver's license or state ID
- Copy of will or affidavit of heirship if not listed on deed as property owner
- The property is the primary residence of the owner

Workshop candidates are anyone who:

- Is delinquent in paying their City or County property taxes
- Wants to learn basic budgeting strategies
- Is interested in learning how to avoid a tax sale
